## **Conservation Features**

To help minimize erosion and protect water quality on a creek on their property the McMillans planted native trees and shrubs along it's banks to serve as a buffer. They also built two stabilized stream crossings for farm equipment and horses, and installed streambank fencing to keep livestock out of the creek.

A good portion of the farm is forested. Poor quality trees were cleared from the forest and water bars were installed to reduce erosion on old logging roads. A forest stewardship plan was developed.

Three season flower beds were installed to encourage pollinators and warm season grasses were planted for pheasants and other wildlife.

## **Benefits**
