Project Specifications

In 2012, the Western Pennsylvania Conservancy received a DEP Growing Greener Grant to improve dirt and gravel roads within the Hypocrite Creek watershed. The Westmoreland Conservation District provided technical assistance and project management to Fairfield Township in improving Bailey's Road, a dirt and gravel road.

The entire 1.3-mile length of Bailey's Road had undergone a major transformation. The road surface was built up, underdrains and crosspipes were added, and in the spring of 2012, the road surface was covered with Driving Surface Aggregate, a compacted mixture of different-sized stone that creates a dense and durable wearing surface.

Benefits/Performance Measures

Not only did these improvements assist Fairfield Township with long term maintenance cost, it also made traveling this road a lot easier for residents, and benefited everyone downstream by reducing the amount of sediment that was eroding off the road and into Tubmill Creek.
