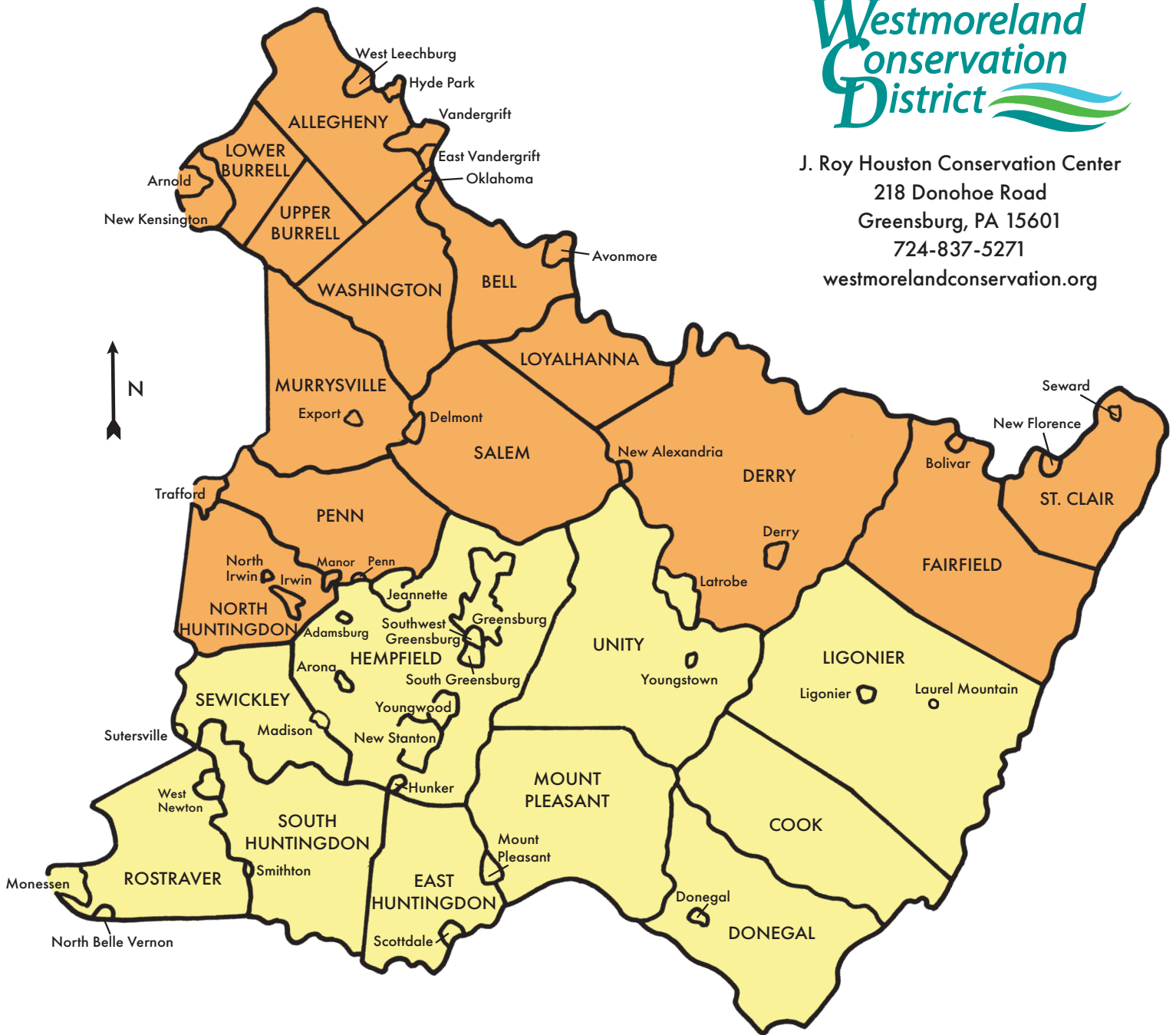

Dirt, Gravel, and Low Volume Roads



The Westmoreland Conservation District administers this program throughout Westmoreland County. Grants are provided to municipalities and public road owning entities who apply to improve their roads, while also making a positive impact to water quality.

Watershed Restoration



The Westmoreland Conservation District provides assistance to property owners who wish to implement stream bank stabilization, install buffers, improve degradation from past mining operations, etc. The District provides technical services and can often assist with grant related projects.

Stormwater Management



The Westmoreland Conservation District provides stormwater management assistance in a multitude of ways. The staff reviews stormwater plans concurrently with municipalities for development projects, assists property owners with evaluation of stormwater complaints and design of stormwater controls, and provides assistance to municipalities implementing their MS-4 plans and requirements.

Agricultural Conservation



The Westmoreland Conservation District provides assistance to farmers to improve their operations and comply with state regulations. The District acts as a liaison to farmers to walk them through the state requirements for nutrient management, soil erosion, and manure management. In addition, assistance can be provided to install best management practices that improve their operation while making a positive impact to water quality.

Erosion and Sediment Control



The Westmoreland Conservation District provides assistance to developers to improve their plans and comply with state regulations. The District reviews plans for developments based on erosion controls, and also inspects active earthmoving sites to ensure the activity is not allowing sediment to impact the county's water quality.

Mosquito Control



The Westmoreland Conservation District provides assistance to citizens of Westmoreland County with concerns regarding mosquitos. The District monitors mosquito breeding habitats and provides surveillance regarding mosquitos that are vectors for disease.

Forestry



The Westmoreland Conservation District provides forest landowners with information and resources to manage their property.
