Project Specifications

Previously the roadside was saturated and remained wet for significant portions of the year. The existing grate was covered and clogged. There was only one crosspipe present at the bottom of the hill that resulted in near constant maintenance due to clogging. The ditches were very deep and resulting in large amounts of erosion.

Benefits/Performance Measures

Replacement of the crosspipe and grate led to reduced maintenance costs for the township. The filling of the ditches also helped to reduce erosion and sediment pollution that enters waterways and negatively impacts aquatic organisms.
